**HISTORY COMES ALIVE AT  
ST. STEPHEN'S HISTORIC CEMETERY TOUR  
SUNDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2019, 2 TO 4 PM**

Millburn, NJ. This Sunday, October, 20, 2019, history will come alive at St. Stephen's historic cemetery. Free guided walking tours of 12 historic gravesites will feature over 30 parishioners of St. Stephen's and several members of the Millburn-Short Hills Historical Society impersonating the local historic and influential community figures who are buried there. Included on the tour will be the resting places of a Civil War Union officer, a prominent arachnologist, a poet, and a Broadway actress. Visitors will gain some interesting insights into the history of our region as well as enjoy the beautiful grounds of this historic cemetery.

Tours will depart from the cemetery gate located at 451 Millburn Avenue, across from Millburn High School, at intervals between 2 and 4 PM, and will last approximately one hour. Guests should wear comfortable walking shoes and be able to walk on uneven ground. Rain date is Sunday, October 27.

St. Stephen's Cemetery opened in 1858 and is located on eight acres of land donated by Israel D. Condit, one of the founders of Millburn. It has been a community cemetery from its beginning, open to members of all faiths. All are welcome to take the tour.
